



Chuck Loray Will Be The New Assistant Principal At Newark High School Beginning July 6th

Beginning July 6th, Chuck Loray will be the new Assistant Principal at Newark High School.

His four-year probationary appointment was unanimously approved May 16th by the NCSD Board of Education.

Loray, who is completing a year-long administrative internship as a Teacher on Special Assignment (TOSA) at the Victor Junior High School, will replace Jason Dentel. Dentel will become the principal of the Union Springs High School July 1st.

"I am grateful for the opportunity to serve as Assistant Principal of Newark High School," he said after being appointed. "Through the interview process, it became clear that students appreciate and value their teachers and opportunities to learn. It was also obvious that teachers and staff are invested in their students and the Newark community. To me, that makes Newark an exciting place to be. I am looking forward to meeting more students, staff, and families!"

Before he began teaching in the VCSD, Loray taught 10th grade Global History at Fairport High School for two years.

He earned his bachelor's degree in history from SUNY Geneseo and his master's degree in special education from Nazareth College. In August he will receive his Certificate of Advanced Study From SUNY Oswego.

Loray and his wife, Kim, who teaches business education at the Andrews Trahey School at the Hillside Children's Center in Rochester, live in Irondequoit with their two children George, 4, and Rose, 2.
