



Daniel McAlpin Appointed To Fill New Human Resources Executive Director Position

The Newark Board of Education October 20th approved the hiring of Bloomfield Middle/High School Principal Daniel McAlpin to fill the new position of Executive Director of the school district's newly-restructured Human Resources Department.

"We did a comprehensive audit of the Human Resource needs in our district last spring which led to the creation of this position," Superintendent Susan Hasenauer said.

In this new role, McAlpin will begin working in the Newark Central School District next month alongside Sue Carr who has capably, but solely, served as the HR personnel assistant with the enormous responsibility of handling matters pertaining to the district's 550 employees since 2008.

"This is an exciting time for the Newark Central School District as we grow our Human Resource department and welcome Dan!," Hasenauer said. "We will be able to move away from district, building and department leaders performing some of the functions and move toward a collaborative department that will be able to provide oversight, alignment and ensure compliance, while continuing to enhance the work Sue Carr has done throughout the years. Furthermore, we can have a laser-like focus on staff recruitment, retainment, enrollment projections and rightsizing our district with high quality staff."

Before becoming Principal of the Bloomfield Middle/High School in 2016, McAlpin served as Assistant Principal there as well as Coordinator of the Middle School grades 6-8 program from 10/2014 until 6/2016.

Prior to that, he served for a year as the ELA Instructional Coach for Geneva Middle School and prior to that he taught Middle School and High School English in Geneva.

McAlpin earned his Bachelor's Degree in English from SUNY Geneseo; his Master's Degree from St. John Fisher College in Educational Administration; and his Certificate of Advanced Studies from Canisius College.

He and wife, Jaclyn, a physical education teacher in Fairport, live in Webster with their three boys, Frank, 7, Ben, 5, and Joe, 2.
