Anne Rogers, a retired Lincoln School first grade teacher, who is serving for the third year in a row as the Red Kettle Campaign Coordinator for Newark, is so appreciative.

"Everyone from the Newark Central School District and the NEC who were ringers made a significant contribution to this year's Red Kettle Campaign because they collectively covered so many hours of ringing," she said December 21st. "And the people in Newark _ the givers _ have been so generous, responding with open hearts."

Rogers said funds raised in Newark directly provide emergency assistance to people in need in our community and are used to provide such things as food, clothing, shelter, medical expenses, utilities, school supplies and even disaster relief, if need be.

Last year, Rogers said Red Kettle ringers "made miracles happen" by raising over \$11,000 in emergency assistance monies for Newark area persons in need.
